

ADVENT KNITALONG 2024

WELCOME TO OUR ADVENT MYSTERY KNITALONG!

This year we will be knitting a square panel which can be used as a Christmas placemat (if knitted in DK yarn) or a dishcloth (in 4ply / fingering weight yarn).

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

To take part, you'll need approximately 40 - 60 grams (90 - 160 metres) of DK yarn in a solid (Christmassy?!) colour and 4mm needles - these should ideally be 20 - 30 cm in length, or knitters may choose to use a circular needle.

Knitters may prefer to knit a slightly smaller square in 4ply/fingering weight yarn which would be perfect as a dishcloth if worked in a cotton blend, in which case you'll need approximately 30 - 45 grams (100 - 160 metres) of 4ply/fingering weight yarn and 3.5mm or 3.75mm needles.

The pattern is worked the same, regardless of yarn weight.

Additionally, 6 stitch markers will be useful to help keep track of where you are in the pattern. These needn't be anything fancy; small loops of scrap yarn or tiny loom bands will do just as well as shop bought stitch markers.

GAUGE/TENSION

If worked in DK yarn at an approximate gauge of 20 st/28 rows per 10cm stocking stitch square, your panel should measure roughly 34cm² after blocking.

If worked in 4ply/fingering weight yarn at an approximate gauge of 23 st/32 rows per 10cm stocking stitch square, your panel should measure roughly 30 cm² after blocking.

HOW THE KNITALONG WORKS

The pattern is laid out across 24 days (1st - 24th December) so it can be knitted throughout the season of Advent and casted off on Christmas Eve, ready for using/gifting on Christmas day.

You will be knitting an average of four rows each day.

Accompanying the knitting instructions each day are some Bible verses, with an introduction kindly written for us this year by Vicky Davies, a local preacher in the Bristol and South Gloucestershire Circuit in the South West of the UK.

STITCH KEY

K = knit

P = purl

st = stitch (or stitches)

pm = place stitch marker on right needle before continuing

sm = slip stitch marker from left needle to right needle before continuing

YO = yarn over (bring the working yarn from the back of the work to the front and continue knitting - this will create an extra stitch which will produce an eyelet on the next row) K2tog = knit the next two stitches together by inserting the right needle into the second stitch along on the left needle, catching the first stitch too and knitting them together to create one stitch on the right needle.

SSK = slip, slip, knit: slip the next two stitches on the left needle individually knit-wise. Then knit those two stitches together through the back loop.

CDD = central double decrease: slip the next two stitches individually knit-wise, knit the next stitch and then pass the 2 slipped stitches over the knitted stitch and drop them off the end of the right needle

REFLECTIONS AND PATTERN

This Advent our reflections will centre on the theme of light in the midst of darkness. For those of us in the Northern part of the Northern hemisphere, Advent coincides with a dark time of year. We get up in darkness in the mornings and it is dark by the time we return home from work again in the late afternoon. The coming of the light of Jesus at Christmas has great symbolic value. But even when it is dark, most of us these days will have easy access to light by the simple flick of a switch. And those of us living in cities are surrounded by the constant glow of light, which reduces the number of visible stars and makes the difference between a full and a new moon almost negligible. Many of us have probably lost that sense of what it means to be trapped in utter darkness, the sense of isolation and disorientation it brings and the consequent preciousness of a light which dispels the darkness. To those living in Biblical times this will have been an everyday experience.



likely Of course, we are all to metaphorical times of encounter darkness in our lives. Times of isolation, confusion and pain. The dark night of our soul. Each day of the knitalong there will be a different verse from the Bible on the theme of light. As you read and meditate on while these verses doing your knitting, consider how they would be

received by someone without easy access to electrical light. And how might they comfort and support you in the dark times of your life.

Many of you will have heard about Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a German pastor, who stood up against the Nazis in the 1930s and '40s. He was imprisoned in Berlin in 1943. In 1944, after the plot to assassinate

Hitler failed and Bonhoeffer's involvement in it came to light, he knew his time was probably up and he was moved to the cellars of the Gestapo headquarters in Prinz-Albrecht-Strasse. Sitting in this heart of darkness he wrote to his fiancée in December 1944 the following words:

[...]

Warm and bright, let the candles burn tonight, Which you brought into our darkness If it can be, bring us together again! We know your light shines in the night.

[...]

Surrounded and protected by powers of goodness, Feeling comforted, we await whatever may come. God is with us in the evening and the morning And most assuredly on every new day.

May we come to know the light of God in our lives, so that we can echo those words when faced with our own darkness.

Cast on 69 stitches fairly loosely.

NB The stitch count stays at 69 st throughout. Odd numbered rows will be the front/right side of the square; even numbered rows will be the back/wrong side.

NB all stitch markers are removed on the following row.

Row 91. (K1, P1) x 34, K1.

Row 92. Work as row 91.

Row 93. Work as row 91.

24TH DECEMBER

Isaiah 42:6-7

I, the Lord, have called you in righteousness; I will take hold of your hand.

I will keep you and will make you to be a covenant for the people and a light for the Gentiles,

to open eyes that are blind,
to free captives from prison

and to release from the dungeon those who sit in darkness.

Cast off all stitches loosely and wet block as follows to open up the lace stitches: soak the square in lukewarm water for half an hour or so until it is fully saturated. Remove it from the water, gently

squeezing out the excess water and lay out flat on a towel or blocking mat to dry. Stretch it out into a square shape and secure with blocking pins if you have got any.

Leave to dry fully before unpinning. Weave in any loose ends and enjoy!
